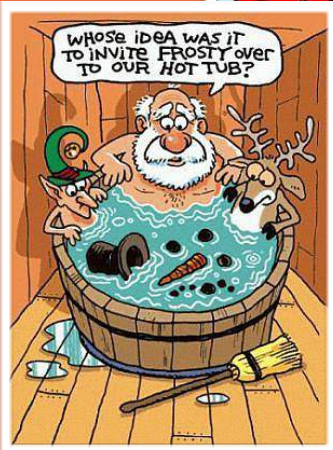

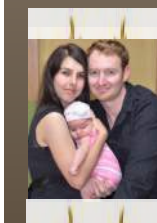


Chapel Day

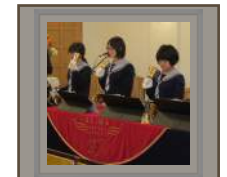
